3) Some Insurance Information: Here is another option for insurance coverage that may be beneficial to your local church. This program is called Missio Benefits Plan and is under the umbrella of the Missio Nexus organization. Our FMC World Ministries Center is beginning their second year of enrollment with this program and has been very happy with the coverage.

They have medical, dental, vision, life, short term disability, long term disability, accident coverage, additional life insurance, ID Shield (new this year), a FLEX Section 125 Cafeteria pre-tax program, and travel coverage. They have a dedicated customer service center, and utilize PlanSource as their third-party administrator for online enrollments, billings, and administration.

Open enrollment starts June 1, and their plan year is July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021. Groups or ministerial individuals may come on at other times, but underwriting takes place with a proof-of-health general questionnaire.
